

<u>Truly, Madly, Guilty</u> by Liane Moriarty

After devouring the enormously popular Big Little Lies by Liane Moriarty, I thought

I just cannot wait for her next novel! Apparently, HBO's producers thought the same and created a series based on that story. Now there is a season two, which Ms. Moriarty is Executive Producer of, and if anyone is interested, the show did have some of the filming take place right here in our charming Sierra Madre village. But I digress. Her next book, *Truly, Madly, Guilty*, follows a similar formula: rich in complex characters, relationships fraught with psychological twists and turns, as well as quite a bit of suspense.

"This is a story that begins with a barbeque." And that is how <u>Truly, Madly, Guilty</u> begins. Featuring two childhood girlfriends, Clementine and Erika who, as it turns out, had a difficult upbringing (think parents who are extreme hoarders and mentally ill) while Clementine'sfairly normal home life provides a refuge for her friend. Presently, they are both married: Erika to Oliver, and they are childless, but orderly, critical and tidy bordering on fanaticism. And Clementine the famous Cellist has two daughters with her husband, Sam, who is having what can only be described as a mid-life crisis. (Their marriage eventually being tested after a dreadful event occurs at the barbeque.)

There is another colorful character, a hearty salt of the earth kind of guy named Vid. He's the one, with his 'smoking hot wife' that invites the two couples, and their kids, over for this barbeque at his mcmansion. The story is deftly woven, keeping us in suspense to find out exactly what terrible thing occurs at the barbeque we keep hearing about. After all, this climactic and traumatic event deeply affects all who are there – including the children. What DID happen at that barbeque? I'll never tell, and I leave it to you dear Reader, to find out.
