The 58th Annual Sierra Madre Art Fair, sponsored by the Friends of the Sierra Madre Library, will be held in Memorial Park, 222 West Sierra Madre Blvd., on **Saturday, May 6**, from 9:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., and **Sunday, May 7**, from 9:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

<u>Sixty (60) artists</u>, including 20 newly juried, will display and sell their works of art. Mediums include oil paintings, jewelry, watercolors, glass, wood, metal, wearable art, photography, pottery, ceramics, mixed media, sculpture and weaving. The Art Fair will be the perfect place to buy Mom that wonderful Mother's Day gift or to buy upcoming graduation and wedding gifts, as well as to purchase pieces for your own enjoyment.



The Featured Artist this year is **Suzanne Kustner**. Her enamels, including jewelry, bowls and pins, will appear on all posters, post cards, flyers, and other promotional materials.

Live **Music** will be featured throughout the weekend in the band shell.
