SOMMER SCHOLARSHIP FUND

The Sommer Scholarship Fund was established by a Deed of Trust by donors John R. Sommer and Cynthia S. Hicks, former Sierra Madre residents who valued our Library. It was signed by the donors and the Chairperson of the Board of Trustees of the Sierra Madre Library on December 31, 1991. The Board of Trustees is the governing Board of the fund. Resolution 10-04, adopted in November 15, 2010, established a Scholarship Committee with the Library Board of Trustees, as well as the President and Treasurer of the Board of the Friends of the Sierra Madre Public Library. The Director of Library Services is now also included. After reviewing the Deed of Trust in 2012 the Library Trustees considered the conditions for the scholarship and ways to promote the scholarship opportunity and in June of that year guidelines were passed.

The committee not only oversees but selects and awards qualified candidates, scholarships to aid in attaining either a library technology certification or an MLIS degree. The scholarships are open to current SMPL library staff or residents of the Sierra Madre community as stated in the Deed of Trust.

Since the fund was established in 1991, at least <u>25 library staff</u> or residents have received monies to pursue their library education. To date over \$50,000 has been awarded to individuals, some of whom still work for the Library! <u>Donations can be made to the Sommer Scholarship Fund</u> when you renew your Friends membership by indicating such on the renewal form or online at <u>www.sierramadrelibrarygriends.org</u>.

BEST USED BOOK SALE

The June Best Used Book Sale earned \$2,264.80. Added to presales of \$3,145.88, the total earnings were **\$5,410.68** since the April sale! It looks like the <u>net earnings</u> <u>for the year</u> will be <u>over \$26,500</u>! This is the highest total ever for the Book Sales. Many thanks to all our volunteers for their hard work and to all the Friends for their wonderful book donations.

The August "Back-to-School" Book Sale will be Friday, August 4 from 3:00-7:00 p.m. and Saturday, August 5 from 10:00 a.m.-2:00 p.m. Everything in the basement will be HALF-OFF at this sale as we need to reduce our inventory for the move. The \$5.00 BAG SALE will be on SATURDAY as usual.

We will be holding our **Annual Silent Auction** in **September** and it will include many signed and collectible books in the Library Display Case.

READER'S REVIEW

My Life in France

By Julia Child with Alex Prud'homme

I had seen some of Julia Child's "The French Chef" shows on PBS and Dan

Aykroyd's satirical sketch as Julia on Saturday Night Live, but I knew few details about her until I watched CNN's 2022 documentary, "Julia." It whetted my appetite to read this memoir, which was written during the last year of her life in collaboration with her great-nephew Alex Prud'homme, who finished it after her death in 2004 at the age of 91.

Her life in France started with her 1948 arrival in Paris with her husband Paul, who worked for the US foreign service. At the time, she had never been to Europe, spoke no French and knew nothing about the country. But as she immersed herself in French culture, buying food at local markets and taking classes at the Cordon Bleu, her life changed forever. Those years in France marked a period of transformation during which she found her calling, leaving behind the life that her conservative. strait-laced father in Pasadena, California had intended for her. At a time when cooking was mainly a male bastion, she became a trailblazer and an inspiration for millions of American women.

Part I of the book recounts her years in Paris and Marseille. Part II covers her struggles to get her "cookery bookery," as she calls it, written and published, the growth of her television career, and her final years in Provence. Julia's story draws not only on her memory, but also on family correspondence from those pre-email and texting days when people actually wrote letters, many of which are cited in this book, along with reproductions of some of Paul's photographs and sketches. The prose captures her distinctive voice, plus her charm, sense of humor and joie de vivre.

The Library has the audiobook version of "My Life in France" and a DVD of the movie "Julie and Julia," which is based in part on this book, starring Meryl Streep as Julia and Stanley Tucci as Paul. And if you want to try cooking like Julia, the Library also has her famous book, "Mastering the Art of French Cooking." As Julia always said at the end of every episode of "The French Chef," Bon Appétit!
