The 59th Annual Sierra Madre Art Fair, sponsored by the Friends of the Sierra Madre Library, will be held in Memorial Park, 222 West Sierra Madre Blvd., on Saturday, May 4, from 9:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., and on Sunday, May 5, from 9:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

More than 60 artists, including 25 newly juried, have already committed to exhibiting. Mediums include oil paintings, jewelry, watercolors, glass, wood, metal, wearable art, photography, pottery, ceramics, mixed media, and weaving. The Art Fair will be the perfect place to buy Mom that wonderful Mother's Day gift or to buy upcoming graduation and wedding gifts, as well as to purchase pieces for your own enjoyment.

The Featured Artist this year is Robin M. Cohen. Her Utah Alabaster sculpture, 'Tree of Fire,' will appear on all posters, post cards, flyers, and other promotional materials.

READER'S REVIEW

The Giver of Stars

By Jojo Moyes

Did you know there were Librarians on horseback during the great depression delivering books to

rural Kentuckians? This was a part of Eleanor Roosevelt's plan to establish a library in each county and hire librarians to ride into the mountains of Appalachia as their delivery route. "Traveling libraries" seems to be a precursor to our own mobile libraries of today.

This is why the story enthralled me as it is based on truth, i.e. it is historical fiction.

Bonus: I'll read anything by esteemed author Jojo Moyes.

A shy English woman, Alice Wright, marries American Bennett Van Cleve in hopes of escaping her boring life in Britain. However small-town Kentucky proves to be stifling as well, especially living in the same house as her caustic father-in-law. Her escape? - a call goes out requiring a group of women to deliver books as part of Eleanor Roosevelt's new plan: packhorse librarians and a traveling library. A perfect outlet for Alice as she signs on enthusiastically.

The group's leader, who becomes Alice's greatest friend and ally, is Margery, an ahead of her time, self-sufficient woman does not ask a man's permission for anything. The two of them join up with other women and word quickly spreads around about these ladies called "the Packhorse Librarians of Kentucky."

I loved reading this dramatic tale of humanity and passion, the loyalty in friendships and justice in their workplace. There was joy realizing that rural folk appreciated – no make that devoured- these books, many of whom could barely read. I was eager to turn the next page to see what happens to them next – and to the men they love. It was bittersweet with humor as well as heartbreak, but fear not - it has a happy ending!

"These heroic women refuse to be cowed by men or by convention. And though they face all kinds of dangers in a landscape that is at times breathtakingly beautiful, at others brutal, they are committed to their job: bringing books to people who have never had any, arming them with facts that will change their lives."

Destined to become a modern classic, <u>The</u> <u>Giver of Stars</u> is available to check out at our temporary location of the Sierra Madre Public Library at 350 West Sierra Madre Blvd.
